

**Getting Your Wheels to Florida**

Comes the winter, and a lot of New Yorkers sprint for Florida. But what do you do for wheels? You can rent them, of course, but that can be expensive if your stay is long. Or you can have your car driven south by a drive-away service. Cost ranges from \$110 to \$170 from New York to Miami. You might also drive down to Lorton, Virginia, and board the Amtrak Auto-Train with your car, going as far south as Sanford, Florida. Effective October 15, that will cost \$245 for two persons and your car, plus an additional \$70 to \$100 for a bunk bed for the seventeen-hour trip.

Now there is a new option: Have your car transported by truck. A new company called Autolog now has six trailers—the same type used by auto manufacturers—that will begin shuttling back and forth between New York and West Palm Beach, Fort Lauderdale, and Miami as of November 1. Depending on the season, the service costs \$174 to \$249, and that includes full insurance on your car and its contents. Cars are dropped off at the major airports, and there is a courtesy-car service to take you to or from the terminal. Delivery takes two days.
